## India and European Union Sign Landmark Free Trade Agreement, the 'Mother of All Deals'



On 27 January 2026, India and the European Union concluded a historic Free Trade Agreement (FTA) after nearly 20 years of talks. The pact is being described by leaders as the “mother of all deals” and aims to boost trade between the two large economic partners, covering nearly a quarter of global GDP and two billion people. Under the agreement, tariffs on most goods and services will be reduced or eliminated, opening up markets for everything from textiles and engineering products to automobiles and wine. Leaders from both sides highlighted that this deal could double bilateral trade over the next few years and strengthen economic cooperation amid a challenging global trade environment.

## Union Budget 2026–27 Presented: Focus on Infrastructure, Manufacturing and Fiscal Discipline”



On 1 February 2026, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman presented the Union Budget 2026-27 in Parliament, outlining the government’s economic roadmap for the coming year. The budget gave strong emphasis to infrastructure development and capital expenditure to support long-term growth, with increased spending on transport, logistics, defence production, renewable energy, and technology-driven sectors. The government reaffirmed its commitment to fiscal discipline, setting a fiscal deficit target of around 4.3% of GDP, while continuing gradual fiscal consolidation. Special focus was placed on strengthening domestic manufacturing under the Make in India initiative, including support for semiconductors, critical minerals, clean energy, and export-oriented industries. Measures for startups, MSMEs, and job creation were also highlighted.

## World Economic Forum 2026 Concludes in Davos as Global Tensions Shape Agenda



The 56th World Economic Forum (WEF) annual meeting held from 19 to 23 January 2026 in Davos, Switzerland drew world leaders, business chiefs, and policymakers. This year’s forum was notable for economic and geopolitical debates amid global uncertainty, including trade tensions and shifting alliances. Discussions focused on global economic cooperation, technology, jobs, and responses to protectionist pressures, with responses to U.S. trade policy and evolving global order dominating talks. The annual meeting of the World Economic Forum in Davos

## Global Order 'Dead', Europe Must Unite, Warns Former Italian Leader”



Former Italian Prime Minister Mario Draghi warned that the current international order is “dead” and urged European nations to strengthen strategic autonomy in defence and economics amid rising tensions with the United States and China. Draghi called for deeper EU cooperation to counterbalance global power shifts and economic pressure, highlighting concerns over NATO relations and security commitments. The commentary reflects broader geopolitical anxieties as Europe grapples with its role amid Russia’s war in Ukraine and shifting alliances. Analysts say this signals a potential shift toward a more assertive European foreign policy to safeguard economic interests and strategic independence.

### The Farewell Ceremony & The Citation Ceremony

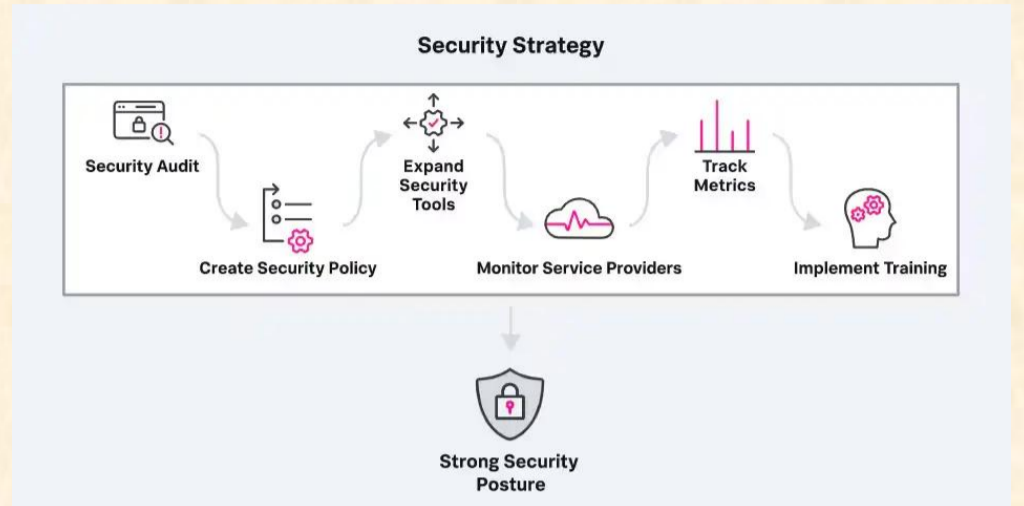

### Vaibhav Sooryavanshi Has Lara's Backlift, Young Tendulkar's Head Position, Dravid's Wrists

Even the seemingly unrelenting Guwahati rain on Tuesday would stop for IPL's most-anticipated duel of the Mumbai Indians vs Rajasthan Royals game. And when Jasprit Bumrah's first delivery landed in the slot on leg-and-middle, Vaibhav Sooryavanshi's bat was already where it needed to be. The ball began its flight towards the long-on stands. The backlift – high, exaggerated, past the vertical – had once again entered the cricketing consciousness of everyone watching. "Every time someone says his backlift is too high, he will get into problems, I chuckle," says Zubin Bharucha, the coach who has mentored Sooryavanshi since he was 13. "He is smashing 155 kmph balls, hitting the likes of Bumrah and Jofra Archer. That's his strength, that's what makes him special"
