POSH WORKSHOP AT BDBBPS

To address this important issue, the school planned and organized a workshop on the Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) specifically for the Pre Primary, Primary, and Middle Wing Teaching Staff on July 29, 2023. The workshop was conducted by esteemed Resource Persons, Dr. Alka Saxena, Deputy Director (Health & Wellness), Blue Bells Group of Schools, and Ms. Kavita Arora, Co-founder and Director of Mittika. This workshop is a part of workshops planned for all teaching and non-teaching staff members under the aegis of the Human Resource Department and Health & Wellness Programme, Blue Bells Group of Schools spearheaded by Dr. Alka.



The primary objective of the Workshop was to raise awareness about the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act, 2013, which is an extension of the Vishaka Guidelines issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court in 1997. By drawing from real-life incidents, the workshop sought to provide a clear understanding of what constitutes unwelcome behaviour or acts as sexual harassment in the workplace. During the session, the responsibilities of both employers and employees were outlined. The participants gained insight into the scope of the act and were sensitized about their rights and responsibilities in relation to sexual harassment.

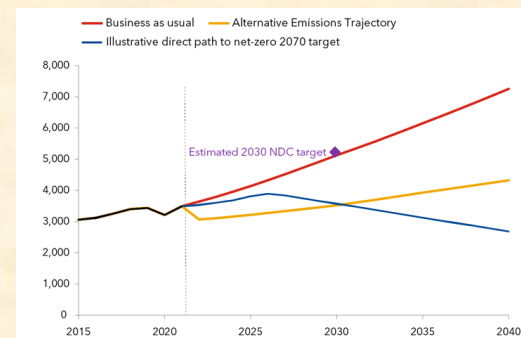
India Succeeds in Reducing Emissions Rate By 33% Over 14 Years

India has recently made an effort to promote green hydrogen, which is produced by splitting water molecules with renewable energy.

According to two officials with knowledge of the most recent assessment prepared for submission to the UN, India's rate of carbon emissions decreased by a faster-than-expected 33% in 14 years as renewable energy output surged and the amount of forest cover expanded.



According to Central Electricity Authority data, 25.3% of India's total power generation in the fiscal year that ended in March came from non-fossil fuel sources, up from 24.6% three years earlier. These sources include hydro, nuclear, and renewable energy.



73% of the electricity used is still generated by Thermal Power Plants, down from roughly 75% in 2019. The major economies that make up the Group of 20 (G20) failed twice last month to reach an agreement on phasing out the use of fossil fuels and on establishing specific goals to reduce emissions.

750 Indian-Origin Women in UK Take Part In 'Saree Walkathon' To Parliament Square



The walkathon was the brainchild of 'British Women in Sarees', to honor National Handloom Day.

The streets of London donned vibrant hues of India as 750 Indian-origin women paraded from the iconic Trafalgar Square to Parliament Square as part of a 'Saree Walkathon'. They adorned state-specific sarees to mark National Handloom Day.

"On August 6, under the radiant sun, 750 of us, joined by 70 marshals, congregated in Central London. The streets reverberated with the chants of 'Vande Mataram' and 'Jana Gana Mana,' accompanied by melodies of popular songs," recounted Dipti Jain,

founder of British Women in Sarees. Representatives from each Indian state held placards, donning weaves that epitomised their regions.

"Just as a saree is woven from thousands of threads, this walkathon is the culmination of thousands of women uniting to represent India in the UK," said Rakhi Singh, who was representing Rajasthan. She donned a leharia-bandhni saree with gota-patti work.

Saree styles from India, like Kantha, Baluchari, Chanderi, Benarasi, Maheshwari, and more, were showcased. The walkathon culminated at the statue of Mahatma Gandhi in Parliament Square, facing the British Parliament.

U.S. Lawmakers Introduce A Resolution to Declare August 15 As 'National Day of Celebration'

A resolution calling for the designation of August 15 as a National Day of Celebration of the World's two largest democracies has been introduced in the



House of Representatives, the lower house of the US Congress. Congressmen Buddy Carter and Brad Sharman are also supporting the motion, which is being sponsored by Indian-American Congressman Shri Thanedar.

The visit to the US by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on June 22 was mentioned in the resolution. According to the statement, the official state visit helped to forge a new level of trust and understanding between the two nations, which was founded on shared values like democracy, pluralism, freedom, and respect for human rights and the rule of law.

Indian Americans in the country serve as government officials, military personnel and law enforcement officers and uphold the US Constitution as well as contribute to the enriching diversity of the nation, the resolution stated.

According to the resolution, Indian Americans in the country serve as government employees, military members, and law enforcement officers, support the US Constitution, and contribute to the nation's enlivening diversity.

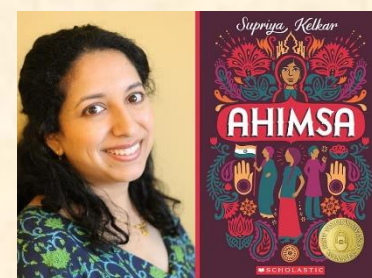

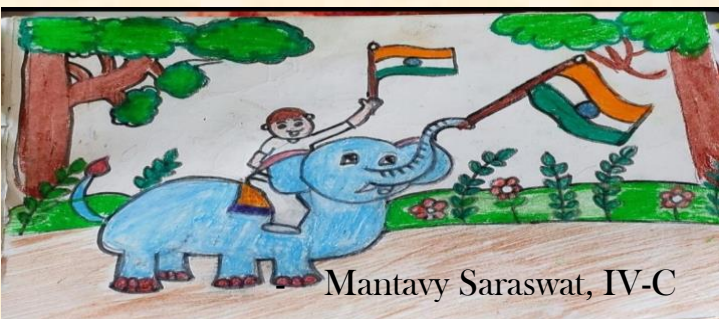

Facts

- 1) "Vande Mataram", meaning "Mother, I bow to thee", was a poem written by Bankim Chandra Chatterjee, an Indian journalist, and activist.
- 2) Sare Jahaan Se Acha Hindustan Hamara, Muhammad Iqbal wrote Saare Jahan Se Accha titled Tarana-e-hind in 1904. It is considered one of the most patriotic songs.
- 3) The Indian national flag with 3 horizontal stripes of red, yellow and green was hoisted on 7th August 1906 at Parsee Bagan Square, Kolkata. The first variant of our current national flag was designed by Pingali Venkayya in 1921.
- 4) The current flag with saffron, white and green stripes with the 24-spoke Ashok Chakra was officially adopted on 22nd July 1947 and hoisted on 15th August 1947.
- 5) The top band of saffron colour represents the strength and courage of the country, the middle band of white colour with Dharma Chakra indicates peace and truth while the last band of green colour shows fertility, growth and auspiciousness of the land.
